

Competitiveness of the agro-food sector, EU agricultural and trade policies and the WTO

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- ④ greatly expanded trade, larger and more integrated markets
- ④ high-value products will constitute a larger share of food expenditure
- ④ increased price competition on international markets from systems able to produce at *low costs* undifferentiated products (commodities) or products with a low level of differentiation (i.e. with a relatively high degree of substitutability with “similar” products)
- ④ increased market opportunities for quality differentiated products

- ④ a CAP supporting firms in the agro-food sector to increase their competitiveness on the markets

three priorities:

- the **economy of scale** competitive wedge
- the **quality-based** competitive wedge
- the **technology-based** competitive wedge

- ④ the ‘base’ payment
- ④ the ‘green’ payment
- ④ the ‘*redistributive payment*’ on the first hectares
- ④ PO also in sectors different from F&V
- ④ supply control in PDO/PGI cheeses and meat-based products
- ④ ‘second pillar’: *enough resources to effectively support innovation and competitiveness?*
- ④ European Innovation Partnership (EIP-AGRI)

EU very active in **deepening** and **widening** trade agreements (tariffs, standards, investments,...)

- © interim *Economic Partnership Agreements* with ACP countries; Central America; Colombia and Peru; South Africa; Mexico; South Korea; Chile
- © Ukraine; Singapore; Moldova, Armenia, Georgia
- © Canada (final steps); Economic Partnership Agreements with ACP countries ; Japan; Malaysia, Thailand and Vietnam; Morocco (Tunisia, Egypt and Jordan); Ecuador; India; Mercosur; the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP) with the US

- ④ the Doha Round stalled in July 2008
- ④ the agreement on a mini-package at the Ministerial in Bali in December
- ④ **what's next?**

the agreement reached in Bali includes the decision to define by the end of the year a new 'work program' for the Doha Round:

- ④ a new agenda? (...start a new Round)
- ④ back to the Doha Agenda?
- ④ taking more time? (...do nothing for a while, ...
while RTAs will continue to proliferate)
