Il Segretario Generale informa che, a seguito dell'approvazione della proposta **SIMPLER** per il periodo 07/2025-12/2028 da parte Agenzia esecutiva per le PMI della Commissione Europea EISMEA, si è proceduto alla sottoscrizione del relativo contratto.

La durata del progetto è di 42 mesi dal 01/07/2025 al 31/12/2028. Il partenariato è composto da: Finlombarda (coordinatore), Innov-hub, FAST, ART-ER, Promos Italia sede di Ravenna e di Milano, Confindustria Lombardia, Confindustria Emilia-Romagna, CNA Lombardia e CNA Emilia-Romagna.

Il budget destinato all'Unione regionale per la realizzazione delle attività SIMPLER ammonta a 543.514.93 euro con un contributo della Commissione Europea pari al 60% dei costi ovvero 328.108.58 euro.

Nell'ambito della rete Enterprise Europe Network, l'Unione regionale organizzerà iniziative di informazione, sensibilizzazione e supporto diretto alle imprese su settori e tematiche particolarmente rilevanti per il tessuto produttivo regionale. In particolare, si focalizzerà su organizzazione di eventi e servizi su programmi, bandi, finanziamenti e normative europei; realizzazione di percorsi di assistenza in tema di supporto alla sostenibilità, transizione energetica, digitalizzazione e internazionalizzazione; promozione e organizzazione di b2b e analisi e rafforzamento delle capacità di gestione dell'innovazione da parte delle PMI.

La partecipazione dell'Unione regionale alla rete Enterprise Europe Network darà un valore aggiunto europeo alle attività e ai servizi che le Camere di commercio stanno già svolgendo attraverso la rete dei PID e altri progetti specifici come i progetti del Fondo di perequazione.

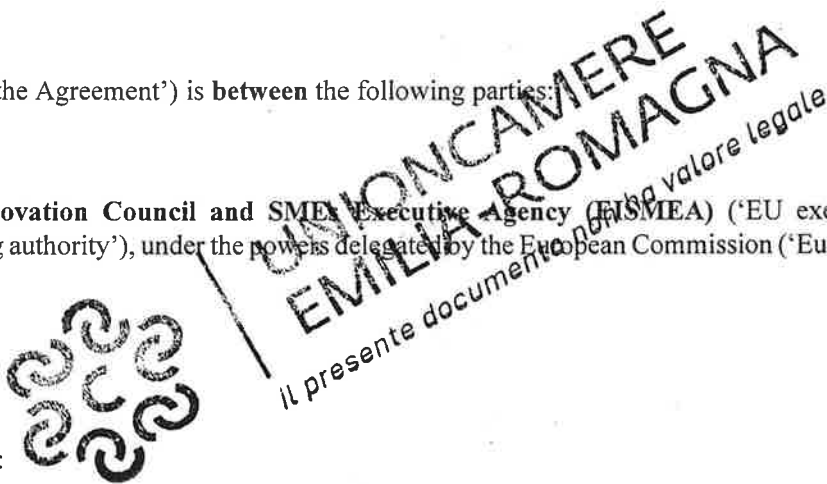

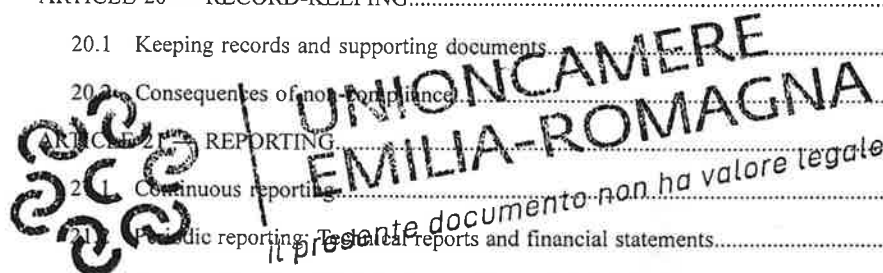
