- high-value products will constitute a larger share of food expenditure
- increased price competition on international markets from systems able to produce at *low* costs undifferentiated products (commodities) or products with a low level of differentiation (i.e. with a relatively high degree of substitutability with "similar" products)
- increased market opportunities for quality

- Interim Economic Partnership Agreements with ACP countries; Central America; Colombia and Peru; South Africa; Mexico; South Korea; Chile
- @Ukraine; Singapore; Moldova, Armenia, Georgia
- ©Canada (final steps); Economic Partnership Agreements with ACP countries ; Japan; Malaysia, Thailand and Vietnam; Morocco (Tunisia, Egypt and Jordan); Ecuador; India; Mercosur; the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (TTIP) with the US
